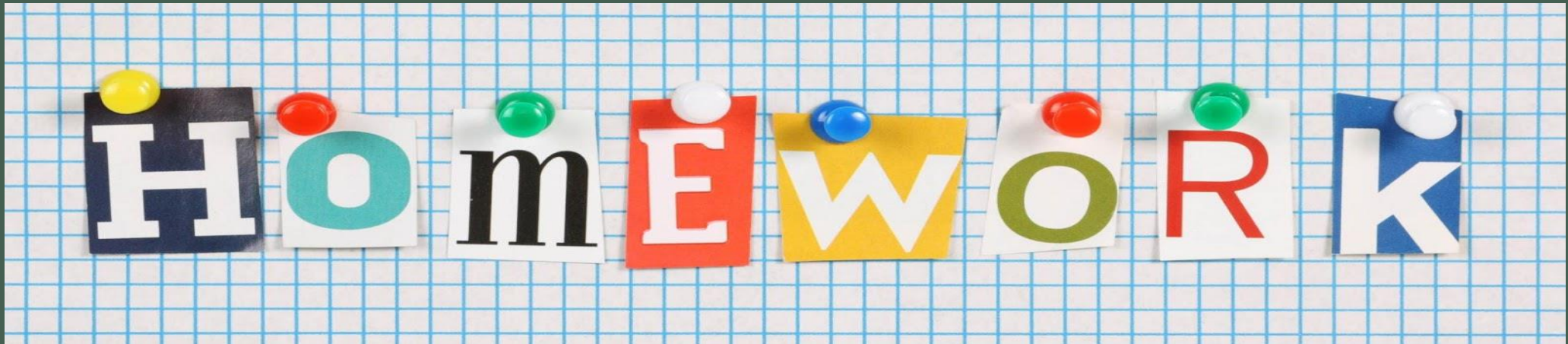

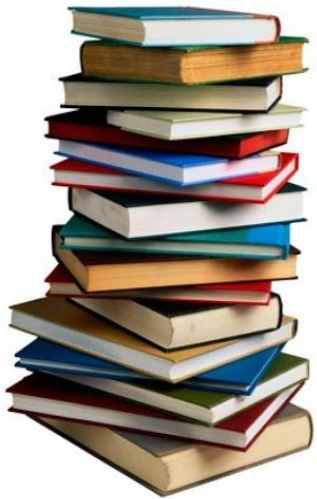

WHAT ARE THESE?

THEY ARE QUANTITIES

Vocabulary

- Countable nouns (Contable): Son sustantivos que se pueden contrar, tales como:
- Libros (Books)



- Huevos (Eggs)
- Horas (Hours)
- Uncountable nouns (No contable): Son sustantivos que no se pueden contra, tales como:
- Tiempo (Time)



- Dinero (Money)
- Azúcar (Sugar)

Do you know how to express quantities?

Las palabras que ustedes utilizan para expresar cantidades son **Much** and **Many**.

Example: I have **many** toys.

She ate too **much** cake.

Pero existen otras formas de expresar cantidades

<i>plenty of</i>	<i>too much/too many</i>
<i>all (of)</i>	<i>a lot of/lots of</i>
<i>much/many</i>	<i>a little/a few</i>
<i>little/few</i>	<i>none of</i>

A lot of / Plenty of

- Podemos usar **a lot of** y **Plenty of** con sustantivos contables y no contables, en oraciones positivas. Por ejemplo
- There is **a lot of** water in the jar. (Water es un sustantivo no contable/ Uncountable noun)
- Don't worry, we have **plenty of** time. (Time es un sustantivo no contable/ Uncountable noun)
- There are **plenty of** bottles in the fridge. (Bottles es un sustantivo contable/ Countable noun)

Enough / Not enough

- Usamos **Enough** para expresar que estamos satisfechos con la cantidad o que hay suficiente. Por otro lado, usamos **Not enough** para expresar nuestro descontento con la cantidad de algo o que no hay suficiente. Ambos son usados con sustantivos contables y no contables.
- There are **not enough** people working at the moment. (People es un sustantivo no contable/ Uncountable noun)
- I think we have **enough** hamburgers for tomorrow's grill. (Apples es un sustantivo contable/ Countable noun)
- She has **enough** time to visit her friends in Dallas. (Time es un sustantivo no contable/ Uncountable noun)
